
Fakes, Frauds and Forgeries

Why?

"Today, genealogy ranks second only to porn as the most searched topic online. According to a January 2012 report by market research firm Global Industry Analysts, an estimated 84 million people around the world spend anywhere from \$1.000 to \$18,000 a year in search of their ancestors. Visitors to online genealogy sites are mostly white women. 55 and older, who browse the Internet from home—or, says [Ancestry.com PR Director Sean] Pate. "your Aunt Betsy, who's got a real rabid appetite for digging into family roots." It's a demographic projected to grow 36 percent by 2020, three times as fast as any other group."

Horatio Gates Somerby, 1805-1872

- The English ancestry of Reverend John Cotton of Boston
 Pedigree of Lawrence; compiled from Heralds' visitations, inquisitions post mortem, deeds, charters, wills, parish registers, and other original manuscripts
- Pedigree of Waldron; compiled from chancer, records in the Tower of London, and from the parish register of Alcester, in Warwickshire
 Arecord of the Blakes of Somersetshire especially in the line of William Blake, of Dornbester, Mass., the emigrant to New England: with one branch of his descendants

Harriet (Bainbridge) De Salis (1829-1908)

The Whitney family of Connecticut, and its affiliations; being an attempt to trace the descendants, as well in the female as the male lines, of Henry Whitney, from 1649 to 1878; to which is prefixed some account of the Whitneys of England, (New York: Priv. Print. | Bradford Press] 1878), 3 volumes

Frederick Adams Virkus (1879-1955)

The abridged compendium of American genealogy; first families of America: a genealogical encyclopedia of the United States, published in Chicago by A. N. Marquis (v. 1), F. A. Virkus (v. 2-3), the Virkus Company (v. 4), and by the Institute of American Genealogy (v. 5-7). 1925-1942.

Brian Leese (1931-1989) alias Baron de Breffny,

- so Doesn't appear to have published under his own name. But has an entire article devoted to his fraudulent activities

Orra Eugene Monnette (1873-1936)

- California chronology: a period of three hundred and fifty years, 1510-1860
- First settlers of ye plantations of Piscataway and Woodbridge, Olde East New Jersey, 1664-1714 : a period of fifty years
- Monnet family genealogy immigrants Isaac (1) and Pierre (1) Monnet
- 50 The Orra Eugene Monnette genealogy catalogue. Genealogy Division. Los Angeles City Public Library
- Slagle family data
- Spirit of patriotism as evidenced by the revolutionary and ancestral records of the Society, Sons of the Revolution, in the state of California

John S. Wurts (1876-1958)

Magna charta, Philadelphia, Pa., Brookfield Pub. Co., (1942)

Gustave Anjou Grand master of fakes and fraud

- Convicted forger (insurance fraud and forger in Sweden). Lived in US under an assumed name (wife's maiden name) reseastanting at \$9.000 (in 1910 dollars!) Later lowered to \$200. Lied about his place of birth, his degrees, his officership
- Lived 1863-1942

The Horn Papers

beware of Volume 3

- Supposedly a collection of original records

 - Period 1765-1795 West Pennsylvania, southeast Ohio, west Maryland and north West Virginia collected by W.F Horn of Topeka, KS
- Published in several PA newspapers and eventually as
- Declared bogus by a committee of historians even before book was published.
- Several types of falsified genealogical records



Mayflower Wannabes

Over 30 known Mayflower "hoaxes" in print including

- Fictional IGI baptismal entries
- Claimed Royal Ancestry
- Extra children
- Extra marriages

The Bogardus Trials A man against the Government?

- Anneke Jans Bogardus early Dutch Colonist owned 62 acres on Manhattan Island.
- 1671 her heirs sold to Governor Lovelace. All heirs signed the deed except heirs of her son Cornelius Bogardus.
 Land presented by Lovelace to Trinity Episcopal Church

- or 1749 & 1757 a descendant took forcible possession of the property and when evicted Sued. He lost twice!

 1784 one of his grandsons tried the same thing and lost.
- 1830 John Bogardus sent a letter to all the descendants he could find asking them for money to help with a suit. They contributed for 14 years!....they lost!

The Humphrey Jennings Estate a tale of pure greed

- William Jennings died June 1798 as an extremely wealthy bachelor.
- He left no will and no heirs of his body.
- By 1821 the estate had basically been settled. Everything went to Lord Coke

The lawsuits/scams -

- Didn't really get rolling until 1847.
- Continued until 1934.
- o Last time this one was tried 1947.



The Lawrence-Towneley Estate

A melodrama - in multiple acts

- A touching story about John Lawrence and Mary Towneley
- Eloped to America -Cruel parents - Religious persecution.
- Repentant father left ONLY daughter an immense fortune.
- m Heirs contacted in 1850s.
- 1888 38 years of "legal fees" later -Frank Alden Hill exposed fraud- wrote book.
- 1900 Lawrence descendants in Texas New York lawyer here we go again

The Baker Hoax

- o Descendants or Relatives of Jacob Baker of Philadelphia
- o Extremely Sophisticated Hoax
- o Went on for 30 years at least
- o Largest "heir hunt" in history o Only hoax where some
- participants actually stood trial 1937!

The Sir Francis Drake Estate

- Dozens of schemes since late 1600s
- o Focused on NY, NJ, PA
- o Still occurs as an Internet "discovery"
